

#### Dear Parents and Carers,



#### Y2 DT Project

Year 2 have been learning to make a Victorian bathing machine in DT. We have learnt to measure and draw accurately using a ruler, and use a saw to cut dowling and create axles for our machine. Some of the children explained in great detail what a bathing machine was and how they made their own.



## Year 3

We would really like to say a big thank you to Nancy from the National Trust who came to visit our Year 3 classes. Our students learnt all about archaeology and artefacts from the Stone Age. The children from Diamonds and Sapphires thoroughly enjoyed the afternoon, especially examining some findings that were over 10,000 years old.

On the 14th and 16th November, Year 2 visited the Museum of East Dorset in Wimborne. The children had a lovely time learning about the life of a Victorian child. They experienced school life where you learnt copperplate handwriting and had to pay a penny each week. Washing day was hard work as everything was done by hand, though the mangle was fun to use. Everyone made their own peg doll and learnt about other Victorian games.
