#### Learning conversations to have at home:

What makes a hero? Can you discuss some real-life heroes with your child? Are there any heroes in your family? Who are they and why? How can you be a hero?

A hero is someone who has courage and has achieved something special. This could be adults at home or adults in the community.

What does 'celebration' mean? What special days do you celebrate? How do you celebrate in different ways?

Celebrating is the celebration of an important day or event, often this involves a social gathering or enjoyable activity helping to celebrate something special.

#### Topic Home learning:

Talk to your child about heroes in books and heroes in real life.

Can you create a picture of someone who is a hero to you and bring it in to share?



#### **Future Careers:**

As part of our learning journey we will be investigating the careers of people who help us. For example, people in the military, police and nurses.

#### Landing:

Children will create and send a postcard to thank an everyday hero.

#### Reading

This term, we will be reading stories linked to our topic 'Heroes". Our first story will be 'A Hero Like You' by Nikki Rogers. Some other stories you might like to share with your child are: 'Supertato' by Sue Hendra, 'Juniper Jupiter' by Lizzy Stewart, 'Midnight Superhero' by Anne Cottringer and 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson.

#### English

#### How can you help at home?

- → Encourage children to practice writing their name with a purpose
- → Encourage children to write and spell words using <u>SATPIN</u>, e.g Tap, Pin, Sat

#### Maths

- ★ Representing numbers to 5
- ★ Shape Circles, Triangles and 4 sided shapes
- **★** Time
- ★ One more one less.

#### How can you help at home?

- → Share stories with numbers such as '3 Billy Goats Gruff' and 'Handa's Hen'
- → Sing counting songs or rhymes
- → Notice numbers and quantities around you and ask questions such as how many? Is this bigger or smaller?

- Listen attentively and respond with relevant questions
- Participate in small group, class and 1:1 discussions
- Express ideas ideas and feelings

- Perform and sing a range of festive songs
